

Our goal is to motivate our student members to shine academically as well as personally, so we truly hope that you will take advantage of this wonderful opportunity in the years to come. We are extremely proud to announce our 2020-2021 MGCAANA Scholar – Lasangi Dhanapala. As this year's MGCAANA scholar, she will receive a \$300.00 scholarship.

Lasangi is currently a Ph.D. student at the Department of Chemistry, University of Connecticut (UConn). Lasangi completed her primary and secondary education at Mahamaya Girls' college until she graduated in 2010, completing her G.C.E A/L examination. After completing her studies, she joined the Institute of Fundamental Studies (IFS), Hantana as a student Research Assistant and her research work there was awarded with a National Research Council (NRC) merit award for scientific publication in 2015. She then joined the Faculty of Science, University of Peradeniya and graduated in 2017 with a First-Class Honors degree specialized in Chemistry. Soon after her graduation, she joined the University of Peradeniya as a Teaching Assistant, where she worked until she joined UConn. Lasangi worked as a Teaching Assistant at UConn in 2017 and 2018, and she was awarded the "Excellence in Teaching" Award for two consecutive years. Currently, she is working as a Research Assistant focusing her studies on the development of microfluidic devices for detection of protein cancer biomarkers, focusing particularly on prostate cancer. The research effort is mainly directed towards developing an early detection system to red-flag cancer before it starts to spread into the aggressive forms.

On behalf of MGCAANA, the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, and the Scholarship Selection Committee would like to sincerely congratulate Lasangi and wish her continued success in her academic and professional pursuits.

Obituary

It is with our deepest sorrow that we inform you the death of Mr. L.B.S. Wickramasinghe, the beloved father of our dear MGCAANA member Mrs. Niranjala Tillakaratne. We, the MGCAANA family wish to extend our sincere condolences to Mrs. Niranjala Tillakaratne and her family during these difficult times. May the love of family and support of the friends bring them comfort during these difficult times.

Please find below obituary shared by Mrs. Niranjala Tillakaratne:

L.B.S. Wickramasinghe passed away peacefully the morning of Sunday, February 14, 2021 in Los Angeles, California after a brief battle with COVID. He was the father of Mahamaya alumnae Dr. Niranjala Tillakaratne (1974) and Manjula Wickramasinghe (1983), and grandfather to Mahamaya alumnae Lalindika Wickramasinghe (2006), Sumudu Abeynayake (until 11th grade, 2003), and Thanuji Ranasinghe (until 10th grade, 2013). He was 93 years old.

Born in 1927 in Nugaliyadda, Pahatha Hewaheta, Kandy, he was the oldest of 4 brothers and 8 sisters. He was in the Sri Lankan police for 40 years and retired as a Chief Police Inspector.

He had 8 children: Damayanthi (husband Harold), Dr. Niranjala (husband Tillak), Lalith (deceased, wife Lathuka Navaratne, Mahamaya alumna 1978), Renuka (late husband Gamini), Kosala (deceased), Manjula (husband Senaka), Chaminda (wife Shakya), and Jagath (wife Yasmika). He had 7 grandchildren: Dr. Lalinda, Mihiri, Lalindika, Sumudu, Thanuji, Ruhara, and Thedara. He was predeceased by his first wife Sumana in 1976, and his second wife Nanda in 2014.

Reaching the New Goal Set for Vidya Scholarship Trust Fund (VSTF)

The Vidya Scholarship Trust Fund (VSTF) set up by MGCAANA provides financial aid to financially-disadvantaged students at Mahamaya Girls' College. Scholarships from VSTF pay for educational expenses and/or boarding fees of students attending Mahamaya. "Vidya," a Sanskrit word, means knowledge or wisdom. Our initial goal was to raise at least \$20,000. We reached this goal in 2019.

To continue this noble cause, a new goal was set to \$30,000, and as of February 2021, \$28,155 has been raised. We were able to donate 13 scholarships for the year 2020 despite Covid related obstacles and school closures.
