They also emphasize the academic and co-curricular life at Mahamaya and the school's ability to produce talented and competent young women who have excelled in their respective fields and serve in national and international spheres.

The Volume also recounts the founding and growth of the Mahamaya Girls' College Alumnae Association f North America since it's inception in 2004.

The Volume was published in Sri Lanka by Godage International Publishers (Pvt) Ltd.

MAHAMAYA GIRLS' COLLEGE KANDY 75 YEARS (1932-2007)


